



Emerging Threats Funding Call: Oropouche Virus

Application Guidance

Scope

The National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR) Health Protection Research Unit in Emerging and Zoonotic Infections (HPRU EZI) and The Pandemic Institute (TPI) in Liverpool are announcing a combined funding call of £300,000 for research on Oropouche virus (OROV). The aim of the investment is to address critical research gaps in OROV knowledge.

Oropouche is an arboviral disease caused by the OROV. It is transmitted to humans through midge or mosquito bites. To date, there is no evidence of human-to-human OROV transmission. The virus has caused large outbreaks in parts of Brazil, Bolivia, Colombia, Peru, and Cuba, with recently imported cases in Spain, Italy, Germany and the USA. The virus is mostly responsible for a febrile "dengue-like" illness, with rashes, headaches and muscle or joint pain. Cases of microcephaly and stillbirth have also been reported.

Potential areas of interest include understanding the epidemiology, spread and transmission, virology, clinical features, disease control and medical countermeasures such as diagnostics, treatments and vaccines.

Funding Available

In total, up to £300,000 funding will be available and we aim to fund a range of projects. The size of grants will vary according to the needs of each research project, but you will need to provide a robust case regarding value for money. We encourage a range of proposals, from smaller proposals with a shorter duration (up to 6 months, £10,000) to larger proposals with a longer duration (up to 12 months, £30,000).

Please note, this is a combined funding pot from NIHR HPRU EZI and TPI, and so eligibility requirements are slightly different for the different pots. We recognise this creates complications; but we think this is offset by the advantage of a single combined funding call. Your application may be eligible for one or two of the funding pots, depending on who it includes as co-applicants.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for support from:

 the NIHR HPRU EZI fund, applications must include at least two partners from University of Liverpool (UoL), Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine (LSTM), University of Oxford (UoX), or the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA). Applications should be led by a principal investigator from one of these partners. TPI Liverpool fund, applications must include at least two partners from UoL, LSTM, Liverpool John Moores University (LJMU), Liverpool University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust (LUHFT), Liverpool City Council (LCC), Liverpool City Region Combined Authority (LCRCA), Knowledge Quarter Liverpool (KQ Liverpool). Applications should be led by a principal investigator from one of these partners.

For NIHR HPRU EZI funded projects, it is expected that funding will start immediately.

Please note, an individual can only be named as a Principal Investigator on one application to this funding call. External investigators can be included as co-applicants.

Full proposals submitted will:

- Address a critical gap in the UKs research response to OROV.
- Provide a robust case for value for money.
- Be deliverable for a total cost of £30,000 or less.

Review Process

Full proposals will be reviewed and scored by a broad, crossdisciplinary panel. Applications will be scored using the following indicators: (1) Scientific quality and impact; (2) Scientific leadership; (3) Justification of resources.
